Purpose

This attachment presents the *Boer Herstel- en Waarheidsinisiatief* as a peaceful administrative effort to preserve evidence, promote truth, and seek restoration of the *Boervolk's* rights.

Boer Restoration and Truth Initiative

(Under the authority of the Temporary Advisory Council of the Zuid Afrikaansche Boer Republics)

Declaration of Peaceful Sovereign Purpose

This document is presented under *natural law and international law*, within a peaceful and non-political framework of the **Zuid-Afrikaansche Boer Republics**. It does not establish a parallel government, but a legitimate *People's Administrative Body*, the *Temporary Advisory Council*, that is empowered to restore, preserve and protect the *Boervolk's* historical, cultural and moral rights.

This Body functions peacefully and independently, without opposition to any de facto authority, but under the legal and spiritual right of the *Boervolk* to restore their honour, self-determination and heritage.

1. Strategic Objectives of the Restoration and Truth Initiative

The **Boer Restoration and Truth Initiative** is a legitimate and humane undertaking that aims to restore truth, memory and accountability in relation to the long history of expropriation, genocide and continued persecution of the *Boervolk* in South Africa.

The initiative was established to:

1. To regain the historical integrity and cultural continuity of the *Boervolk*.
2. Collect and preserve evidence of crimes against our people.
3. Promote reconciliation through truth, documentation, and lawful redress.
4. Rebuild a people's administration based on natural law, honour, and justice.

2. Evidence and Documentation Archive

An **evidence archive** will be established as an official body under the *Temporary Advisory Council*, to collect, preserve and protect all evidence of crimes, human rights violations and unlawful expropriations against the *Boervolk*.

This archive will include:

1. Affidavits and testimonies from survivors and families.
2. Historical records, list of concentration camps, and expropriation documents.
3. Correspondence with governments and foreign agencies showing unlawful interference.
4. Reports on ongoing **farm murders and rural genocide**, with verified death lists and investigation reports.

The archive will serve as a legitimate and internationally valid evidentiary record of the *Boervolk's* continued suffering and their legitimate claim to justice, peace and restoration.

3. Truth and Reparations Commission (Independent Proposal)

An independent **Boer Truth and Restoration Commission** will be proposed, based on moral and legitimate principles, but entirely free of political or corporate influence.

This Commission will:

1. Hear testimonies from victims and families of the **Boer genocide**, including the **126+ concentration camps** and the ongoing farm murders.
2. Examine patterns of expropriation, slavery and systematic persecution.
3. Recommend legal and moral steps for reconciliation and restoration under *common law*.
4. Submit findings to international human rights and international law platforms.

4. International Awareness and Media Communication

A legitimate **Media and Awareness Office** will engage with international journalists, human rights observers and global bodies to expose the ongoing injustices against the *Boervolk*.

The office will:

1. Reveal the humanitarian crisis of **farm murders** and rural attacks.
2. Highlight the role of foreign governments and local structures in the concealment or denial of these crimes.
3. Restore the narrative: the *Boervolk's* struggle for independence was never racist, but *legitimate, defensive, and rooted in ancestral sovereignty*.
4. Maintain a neutral, factual, and documented tone in all international communications.

5. Lawful Framework and Jurisdiction

This Initiative operates under:

1. *Natural Law and Common Law*
2. *Customary International Law*
3. *The innate rights of sovereign peoples as recognized in the Peace of Westphalia (1648), UNDRIP (2007), and international moral law.*

The jurisdiction extends over all territories historically recognized as Boer Republics, and operations are limited to rightful restoration, heritage protection, and peaceful administration.

Protection clause

This Body functions **peacefully, legitimately and non-politically**, within the sovereign heritage of the Zuid-Afrikaansche Boer Republics. It does not stand in opposition to any de facto structure but acts as a legitimate cultural and humanitarian administration for the preservation, restoration and continuation of structure and their Republics.

Note

This initiative operates in good faith, focusing on cultural preservation and reconciliation, aligning with UNDRIP principles of self-determination and protection against assimilation.
